

Description: Age about fifty, height 5 ft. 9 in., stout build, fair complexion and eyebrows, grey hair, blue eyes, heavy ginger moustache, discoloured teeth, short thick nose inclined to left; dressed in a grey-tweed check suit, "Smith & Caughey, Queen Street, Auckland," on tab of coat, striped blue shirt, black lace-up boots (size 8), Improved Governor collar (size 15½), with two indistinct numbers in marking-ink, like "A 473" and "A 431." A razor found near the body was branded "Stern, 794."
