INVERCARGILL.—About 2.15 p.m. on the 31st ultimo the bodies of two prematurely born male children were found on the beach at Invercargill. They were wrapped in several sheets of newspaper (one an Invercargill evening paper of 29th October, 1924), a sheet of brown paper, and a towel. Medical examination revealed that they were six or seven months' children, one of whom was still-born, and that their birth had taken place not more than twenty-four hours previous to discovery of the bodies on the beach. Any information regarding parentage, &c., is to be communicated to the Inspector of Police, Invercargill.
