

## SPECIAL NOTICE.

### Murder.

Kurow.—22nd instant on warrant for the murder of Olive Jean Rutherford, Caversham, Dunedin, Philip Richard Hudson, age nineteen, height 5 ft. 6 in./ student, native of New Zealand, slight build, sallow complexion, dark short hair, brown eyes, drossed in a brownish-grey suit and black shoes. At about 7.30 a.m. on above date accused was seen sitting in his motor car on the roadside near Omarama. Shortly afterwards the car and deceased were found in the bed of the Waitaki River, having fallen over a cliff. A discharged rifle cartridge was found near deceased and another near the motor-car. Medical examination revealed a rifle-bullet in deceased's brain.
