

# "STOP."

Face the driver, extend one hand forward slightly above the level of the head, palm of the hand towards the driver of the vehicle, fingers upwards and close together. When the driver observes the signal, immediately turn and stop the traffic from the opposite direction in the same manner, at the same time extending the left arm horizontally from the shoulder to prevent the traffic behind the constable from moving until the release signal is given.

#### "GO."

If the signal is given with the right arm, extend the arm backwards at full length in line with the shoulder, make a sweep forward and across until the hand almost touches the left shoulder; the hand should be on the level of the shoulder throughout the motion.

If the signal is given with the left arm, extend the arm backwards in line with the shoulder, and give a circular sweep forward until the hand almost touches the right shoulder, keeping the hand on the level of the shoulder throughout the operation.
