

Relicensing of Motor-vehicles.

The period for relicensing motor-vehicles in New Zealand has closed for the year. There is still a very large number of vehicles not relicensed; and, although it may be taken as correct that many have outlived their usefulness and will not be relicensed, it has come to my personal observation that cars have been used with the old green-and-white number-plates thereon.

It would be a great help to the completion of the work if your officers, particularly in the outlying districts, took immediate action where there are noticed motor-vehicles which do not bear two of the new black-and-white plates. It may be stated that in the cities there is practically no evidence of the continued use of green-and-white plates, but with so many vehicles on which this year's fees have not yet been paid it is likely that some may come under the notice of your officers.

It is, of course, understood that so long as a vehicle is not used on any public road it does not require to be relicensed.
