

When notifying the arrest of persons charged with theft, or suspected of theft, it should be stated whether the property stolen, or any portion of it, has been recovered.

A description of property supposed to be stolen, found in the possession of offenders, for which owners cannot be found, shall be furnished for insertion in the Gazette.

PERSONS WANTED.

WHANGAREI.—29th ultimo, on warrant of commitment to Whangarei Prison for forty-eight hours in default of paying £1 12s. fine and costs for refusing to quit licensed premises, William Brock, age forty-three, height 5 ft. 9 in., labourer, native of Ireland, strong build, fresh complexion, dark-brown hair, blue eyes, scar under left eye; dirty appearance.

Board," to it, and uttered it to Edward John Ivory, licensee, Caledonian Hotel, in payment of £1 7s. for two bottles of whisky which he said he would call for later. The photograph of John Reginald Ellis, alias Robert Lucas, alias Jack Clarke, referred to in Police Gazette, 1926, page 367, and Photographs, 1919, page 53, has been identified as that of accused. In addition to the above chequebook he may be in possession of cheques on the National Bank of New Zealand, Courtenay Place, Nos. D27550 to D27560. There are other charges pending.

Wellington.—9th ultimo, on warrant for receiving from Edgar Love (age fifteen) a blue-cloth overcoat and a pull-over jersey (recovered), value £8 8s., the property of the Union Clothing Company, 155 Riddiford Street, knowing them to have been stolen. Alex Vargo, age twnety-five, height 5 ft. 4 in., painter and seaman, native of America, medium build, fresh complexion, dark hair, hazel eyes; usually dressed in a grey suit, pull-over jersey, and light cap; walks with head slightly forward.
