Payment of Expenses of Witnesses.

It has been arranged with the Justice Department that expenses of witnesses for attendance at the Magistrate's Court in cases of indictable offences in which the accused is committed for trial shall be paid from Imprest by this Department immediately after committal, in the same way as payment is now made in cases where the accused pleads guilty and is committed for sentence. Voucher Form No. 91a is to be used for this purpose, and the statement at the foot of the form is to be amended by inserting the word "not" before "guilty," and substituting "trial" for "sentence." A certificate of the expenses allowed by the Magistrate or Justices will be furnished to the police by the Clerk of Court, and this must be attached to the voucher (Form 91a), which will be scheduled in the Imprest Account as chargeable against Justice Department.
