

### PERSONS WANTED.

Auckland.—5th instant, for escaping from Auckland Prison, Samuel Arthur Pudney, alias Ted Smith, alias Jones, age thirty-four, height 5 ft. 6½ in., labourer and butcher, native of Australia, dark complexion, black hair, brown eyes, scar on left middle finger and on right groin, mole on neck; dressed in blue dungaree trousers, grey coat, no hat or boots.
