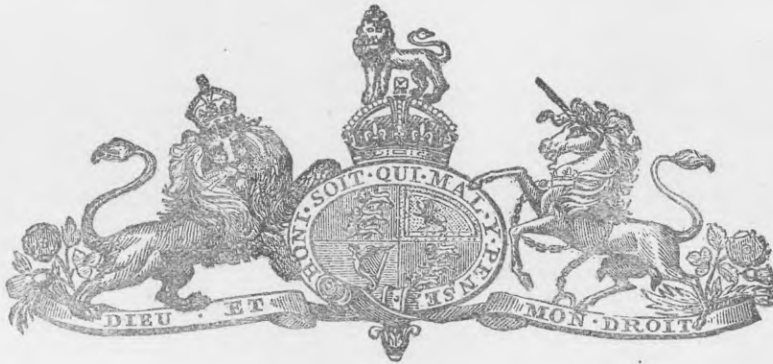

PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—17th instant, that he may be located, **Michael Dunne**, age fifty-six, height 5 ft. 9 in., diver and seaman, native of England, stout build, fresh complexion, blue eyes, Crucifix and other tattoo-marks on arms. His wife has applied to the North London Police Court for a separation order, and he is to be interviewed regarding the matter. If he is located a communication is to be sent to the Superintendent of Police, Auckland, who will forward the file.

KATIKATI.—29th August last: Inquiries are to be made for **Dick Edwards**, age about twenty-eight, height about 5 ft. 8 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, strong build, fresh complexion, fair hair, blue eyes; usually dressed in a blue serge suit (seldom wears a hat); frequents billiard-saloons. He is suspected of having obtained £10 from Lewis Klee, hairdresser, Katikati, by means of a forged telegram purporting to be sent by Alfred Wallace. **No warrant.**

WHAKATANE.—21st December last, on two warrants of commitment to Whakatane Prison for fourteen days on each in default of paying £6 6s. fines and costs for assault (two charges), **Eru Davis**, age twenty-five, height 5 ft. 5 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, dark complexion, black hair, brown eyes, two scars on throat; a half-caste Maori. JOHNSONVILLE.—18th ultimo, for escaping from Porirua Mental Hospital, **Defia Elizabeth Roberts**, age forty, height 5 ft. 4 in., domestic, native of New Zealand, slight build, dark hair turning grey; dressed in a blue dress with white stripes.

Jackson** (name probably fictitious), age about thirty-three, height about 5 ft. 7 in., strong build, dark complexion and hair; dressed in a dark tweed suit and felt hat; may have slight impediment in speech. O'Brien, carrier, to one for £10 and uttered it to Marita Gustofson, licensee, Post Office Hotel. He forged the other cheque for a similar amount and uttered it to Thomas Colman, licensee, Grand Hotel. **No warrant.**

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION.

Circular No. 9/28.]

Constables entering Licensed Premises.

In every case where a constable, in the execution of his duty or in uniform, has occasion to enter licensed premises conducted under a publican's license, accommodation license, or conditional license a written report of the entry shall be made by him as soon as possible after the time of the occurrence.

If the constable is performing duty under a sergeant at the time of the occurrence he shall also at the first available opportunity verbally report the matter to his sergeant.

In cases where constables are performing duty at out-stations, and are not under the immediate control of a sergeant, an entry is to be made in the station diary giving briefly the reason for visiting such licensed premises in the execution of duty or in uniform, and the result of the visit.

Circular No 13/98 is hereby revoked.
