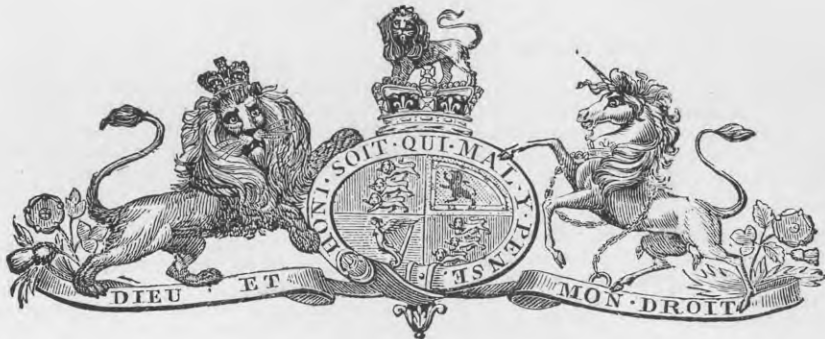

PERSONS WANTED.

KAWAKAWA.—**James McKeach**, abduction: it has been ascertained by the Kawakawa police that he is identical with **James Henry McKeich**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1928, page 38. (See Police Gazette, 1928, page 131.)

WHANGAREI.—23rd ultimo, on **warrant** for theft of two felt hats (recovered), value £4 4s. 6d., the property of Albert J. Dawson and another, Settlers' Hotel, **George Wilson**, age about thirty, height about 5 ft. 7 in., labourer, native of New Zealand, slight build, dark florid complexion, dark-brown hair; dressed in a grey suit and grey felt hat; talkative. The hats were stolen from the Settlers' Hotel, and were subsequently recovered at Hikurangi from Frederick John Holt, to whom they were given by accused.
