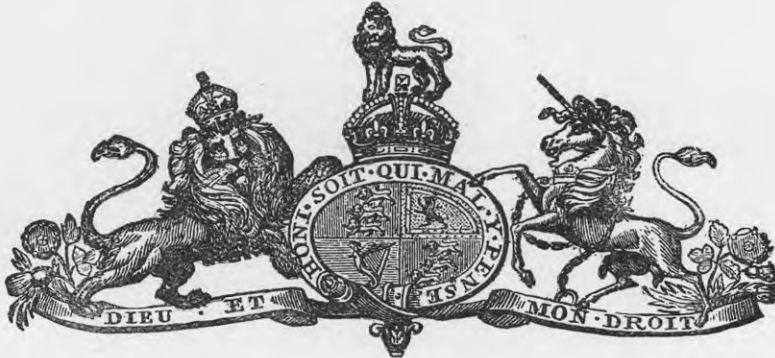

**AUCKLAND.**—18th ultimo, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for six months in default of paying £166 13s. arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of his wife, **John William Hope**, alias **J.
