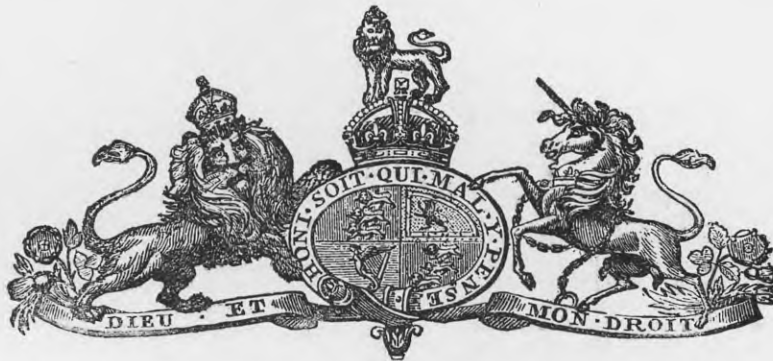

## SPECIAL NOTICE.

A notorious criminal named **John Duncan Campbell**, alias **Alexander Littlejohn**, alias **William Swarbrick**, whose photograph appears in New South Wales Photographs, Vol. 103, page 261, is in this Dominion, and was convicted of theft at Auckland in January last, vide Police Gazette, 1929, page 106.
