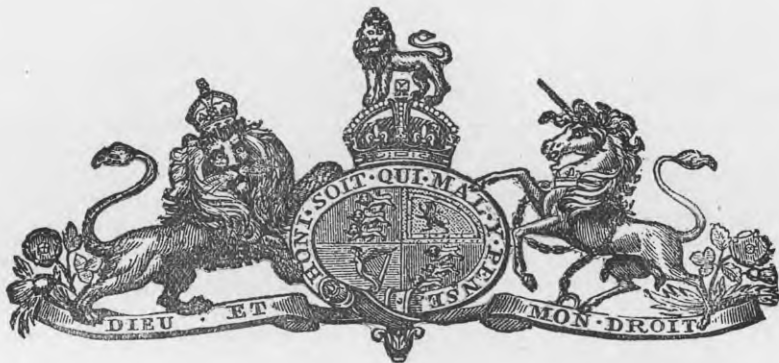

PERSONS WANTED.

WARKWORTH.—20th January last, on **warrant** for theft of £1 7s. 6d. (recovered), the property of Alexander John Hatfield, farmer, Waiwera, **William Venice Aitken**, alias **William Vanis Aitken**, alias **William Vanis Foot**, age thirty-three, height 5 ft. 6 in., mechanic and labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, fair complexion, dark-brown hair, brown eyes; no upper teeth; dressed in a grey suit and cap. WANGANUI.—5th instant, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his wife, Vida Elvene Cameron, 27 Somme Parade, **Donald Charles Cameron**, age twenty-six, height 5 ft. 10 in., salesman, native of New Zealand, medium build, sallow complexion, black hair, weak brown eyes, cleft in chin, limbs slightly and wears size nine boot on one foot and size six on the other; dressed in a light-grey suit with double-breasted coat, and light felt hat, and wears tortoise-shell pince-nez; quiet manner; good address. He wrote to his wife stating that he intended leaving New Zealand. His photograph is filed. *Cancelled 17-4-29.*

WAIPIKURAU.—18th ultimo, on **warrant** for false pretences, **D. Campbell**, alias **Stewart**, alias **A. Wallace**, age about forty-seven, height 5 ft. 8 in., fair complexion, ginger moustache; dressed in light-brown suit. Accused obtained £1 from Annie Beatrice Meinung, Boardinghouse-keeper, by means of a valueless cheque for £2 0s. 6d. which he tendered in payment of £1 for board. He also cashed another valueless cheque at Takapau. *See 3/7/29*

PALMERSTON NORTH.—11th December last, on **warrant** of commitment to Wellington Prison for two months in default of paying £30 10s. arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of his wife, Emily Jane Turvey, **Frank Frederick Turvey**, age fifty-eight, height 5 ft. 10½ in., bricklayer and labourer, native of England, slight build, sallow complexion, black hair turning grey, brown eyes, lump on right cheek, scar on right wrist, long features, long ginger moustache. EKETAHUNA.—12th instant, on **warrant** of commitment to Wellington Prison for fourteen days in default of paying £1 10s. fine and costs for driving a motor-vehicle without a license, **Charles James Hickling**, age twenty-seven, height 5 ft. 6 in., baker, native of New Zealand, stout build, fresh complexion, dark hair, blue eyes; dressed in a grey suit, light felt hat, and tan shoes; lips. WELLINGTON.—24th January last, that proceedings for failing to register a double-barrel breech-loading shot-gun may be instituted against him, **Donald De Wet Rucker**, veterinary surgeon, native of America. He arrived at Wellington from San Francisco on the 14th January last, and was granted a permit, No. 2671, to bring the shot-gun into New Zealand. As he said he was leaving for Auckland next day he was instructed to register the weapon there, but he has failed to do so.

WELLINGTON.—11th ultimo, that proceedings for failing to register a .22 calibre Savage rifle may be instituted against him, **Robert Malcolmson**, age twenty-four, farm hand, native of Ireland. He arrived at Wellington from Sydney on the 29th January last, and was granted a permit, No. 2678, to bring the rifle into New Zealand, and he was instructed to have it registered within seven days. Registration has not been effected.

WELLINGTON.—15th instant, on **warrant** for false pretences, **G. Payne** (name probably fictitious); dressed in a black serge or worsted suit, greyish-fawn soft hat, blue-grey mottled tie, one upper tooth missing and other teeth discoloured. Accused obtained £10 from James Smith (Limited), furnishers, &c., Manners Street, by means of a valueless cheque for £50 on the National Bank of New Zealand, Wellington, which he tendered in payment for furniture, value £40. The furniture was sent to the address given by him—64 Upland Road, Wellington—and it was found that he rented the house, but never occupied it. There are other similar charges pending. On the 8th instant he opened an account at the National Bank of New Zealand, Wellington, in the name of **G. Payne**, depositing £25, and was supplied with a cheque-book, Nos. V.14041-14064. Between the 8th and 15th he drew two cheques on his account for £10 and £14 4s., payable to self. He rented an office in Lambton Quay and circularized several business firms to the effect that he was commencing business in Wellington as a financial agent, trading under the name of Messrs. G. Payne and Sons, financial agents. He may continue his fraudulent operations in other towns, or he may endeavour to leave this Dominion. The photograph of **Henry Lloyd**, alias **Alfred Apps**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1929, page 137, and Photographs, 1926, page 36, has been identified as that of the accused.
