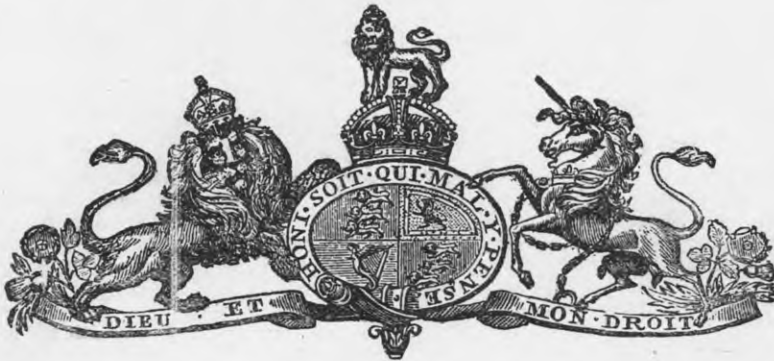

AUCKLAND.—Between the 6th and 7th instant the detonator magazine at Westfield, the property of the Otahuhu Borough Council, was forced open and seventy-five detonators, value 6s. 6d., stolen.

PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—15th May last, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for two months in default of paying £22 16s. arrears due on a maintenance order for the support of his illegitimate child, **Allan Sidney Adams**, age nineteen, height 5 ft. 6 in., piano-tuner, native of New Zealand, medium build, fresh complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes.
