

In future all communications between the members of the Force and the Government Statistician in relation to the collection of these statistics are to be forwarded through the Commissioner.

The collection is not to be undertaken by non-commissioned officers, and constables shall not enter into any agreement to collect them without first having obtained authority from the officer in charge of the police district in which they are stationed.

District officers shall not grant approval in any case where this Department will have to bear any expense to enable the work to be done or where such cannot be done without interfering with the proper and full performance of police duties.
