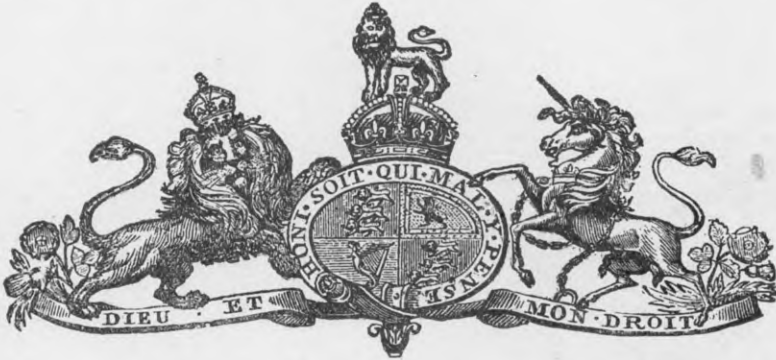

Apparently he has some knowledge of chemistry, and manufactures and sells preventive pessaries. He is very plausible, invariably stays at private houses, and by advertisement and otherwise procures the acquaintance of young women, from whom he obtains money. There are other charges pending. **No warrant.**
