MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION.

Circular No. 3/1931.]

Police Motor Transport.

1. A departmental allowance in respect of a motor-car covers all ordinary police duty within the sub-district con-cerned, including the conveyance of prisoners within such sub-district.

2. With the approval of the Officer in Charge of the district a member of the Force, whether he is in receipt of a depart-mental motor allowance or not, may convey any other member of the Force on duty in his motor-vehicle and be paid a mileage

of the Force on duty in his motor-vehicle and so paid allowance on the following scale:

Motor-vehicles of R.A.C. rating of 7/9 h.p. or less conveying up to two passengers, excluding the driver, 4d. per mile; and for all passengers in excess of two, an additional lad. per mile.

Motor rehicles of higher R.A.C. rating conveying up to

Motor-vehicles of higher R.A.C. rating conveying up to two passengers, excluding the driver, 6d. per mile; and for all passengers in excess of two, an additional 2d. per mile, provided the cost is less than for a hired vehicle.

vehicle.

3. The conveyance of prisoners from within a sub-district to a place beyond it shall be by police van or other Government transport, or by public coach, mail-service vehicle, or steamer, when such is conveniently available. When not conveniently available, or when for special departmental reasons such Government or other transport is undesirable, a motor-vehicle the private property of a member of the Force may be used on payment of mileage allowance as above.

4. Unless in very special circumstances, prisoners should not be conveyed beyond the nearest lock-up in a vehicle driven by the escorting constable unless accompanied by an assistant, owing to the driver's usual inability to exercise adequate control over his prisoner.

5. In order to comply with the provisions of the Motorvehicles Insurance (Third-party Risks) Act, 1928, all privately-owned cars used on departmental business require to be insured under Class 5 of the Second Schedule of the Regulations under that Act. Vouchers for payment for use of motorvehicles on mileage basis shall, in addition to a statement that the car used has been insured, state the make and h.p. of the vehicle. of the vehicle.

6. Members of the Force travelling on departmental business shall travel by train when such is conveniently available, but when other means of public transport has to

available, but when other means of public transport has to be used preference is to be given to mail contractors' vehicles, providing their time-table is suitable and the fare charged does not exceed that of any competitor.

7. Members of the Force who are not in receipt of a departmental motor allowance and who, with the approval of the Officer in Charge of the district, use their own motorcycles on duty will be paid at the rate of 2d. per mile travelled, with an additional lide per mile whom a presenger on official

cycles on duty will be paid at the rate of 2d. per mile travelled, with an additional ½d. per mile when a passenger on official business is conveyed by the motor-cycle.

8. Commissioner's memoranda of 2nd December, 1925 (P. 22/496), 12th July, 1927 (P. 27/991), 1st February, 1929 (P. 27/991), 6th September, 1929 (P. 29/1330), and 22nd May, 1930 (P. 30/360), also Circulars 19/1921, 8/1922, and 8/1930, are cancelled.

9. The above mentioned payments are at present subject.
