MACHINERY INSPECTION FEES.

The procedure adopted by this Department with regard to the inspection of machinery is to issue a fee notice to the owner after the inspection takes place, calling upon him to pay the scale inspection fee and advising him that if payment is made within one month he is entitled to a certain stipulated reduction. If payment is delayed beyond the month the full statutory fee is payable.

Machinery owners are given the option of paying the fees at the nearest postal money-order office or direct to Head Office, or to Public Account at the nearest branch of the Bank of New Zealand, in which case the bank receipt must be for-warded to this Department.

Immediately the fees reach this office the certificates are despatched to the machinery owners.

If payment is not received within reasonable time after the despatch of the first notice, a final notice is issued, and if this does not have the desired effect a request is issued to your local office to have the case investigated.

In this connection it is as well for your officers to know that when a fee is paid at a postal money-order office a period of about three weeks elapses before it reaches this Depart-ment. This delay is due to the accounting methods of the Post and Telegraph Department, and, although every en-deavour has been made to have the interval reduced, the Post and Telegraph Department is unable to assist us in that direction. The consequence is that your officers sometimes receive a request to investigate a case and find that the fee has been paid at the local post-office, perhaps a week or a fortnight previously.

The main object of police investigation so far as this De-partment is concerned is to effect payment of the fee. In cases where calling upon the owner personally necessitates travelling some distance a telephone call or a note from a local constable will in most cases have the desired effect, but, if it does not, then an endeavour should be made to obtain evidence that the machinery is in use, as the working of machinery without being in possession of the current certi-ficate renders the owner liable to a fine up to £100, and the Department does not hesitate to prosecute for this offence in recalcitrant cases.

There are probably instances in which your officers are asked by the owner to take a fee in order to save him a trip into town, but there is no necessity to forward the money here by registered post. The amount may be paid into the local post-office and the receipt forwarded to the owner, or, alter-natively, lodged to the credit of the Public Account at the nearest branch of the Bank of New Zealand and the depart-mental portion of the receipt forwarded to this office and the other portion to the owner.

In conclusion I may say that the collection of machinery inspection fees, particularly of the smaller amounts ranging from 2s. 6d. to £1, costs this Department a good deal of trouble, and your officers have always been of invaluable assistance in this connection. A word from a policeman is more effective than any written demand, no matter how strongly worded.

Regulations for the Regulating of the Import and Export of Coined Silver. Move See New Lealand Gazette, 1931, page 2145.) Ser BLEDISLOE, Governor-General. Rep. 1941 ORDER IN COUNCIL. At McClovernment House at Wellington, this 20th day of July, 1931.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

Insubscription the doversion of the powers conferred on him by section twelve of the Finance Act, 1931 (No. 2), and of all other powers and authorities enabling him in this behalf, His Excellency the Governor-General of the Dominion of New Zealand, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Dominion, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said section.

REGULATIONS.

1. THESE regulations may be cited as "The Coined Silver Regulations, 1931.'

2. These regulations shall come into force on the date of publication hereof in the *Gazette*.

3. In these regulations-

"Minister" means the Minister of Finance :

" Minister" means the sinister of rinate.
" Value," in the case of a coin which is legal currency in New Zealand or which purports to be of the same denomination as that of a coin which is legal currency in New Zealand, means "face value."

4. No person shall import or attempt to import into New Zealand, or export or attempt to export from New Zealand, any coined silver otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of these regulations.

5. It shall be lawful for any person arriving in New Zealand to bring with him into New Zealand on such arrival any amount of coined silver not exceeding in value £2 or such larger sum as the Minister may permit.

6. It shall be lawful for any person leaving New Zealand to take with him on his departure from New Zealand an amount of coined silver not exceeding £5 or such larger sum as the Minister may permit.

7. It shall be lawful for any person leaving New Zealand with the intention of proceeding to Great Britain or Ireland by direct route, without transhipment from the vessel in which he leaves New Zealand, to take with him an amount of coined silver not exceeding £10 or such larger sum as the Minister may permit.

8. The Minister may grant permission for the exportation of worn or mutilated coined silver which is or has been legal tender and is intended to be returned to the Royal mint.

9. The Minister may grant permission for the importation of supplies of new coined silver struck at the Royal mint for the purpose of increasing or replenishing the currency of the Dominion.

10. Any permission given by the Minister under the fore-going provisions of these regulations shall be in writing under going provisions of these regulations shall be in writing inder the hand of the Minister, and may relate to any particular transaction or to any class of transactions therein described, and may be given subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Minister in his discretion thinks fit.

11. The Minister may in any special case by writing under his hand authorize the exportation or importation of coined silver subject to such conditions or restrictions as the Minister in his discretion thinks fit.

12. These regulations shall not apply to the importation or exportation of any coincd silver, whether legal tender or not, which is more than one hundred years old, or any coincd silver, whether legal tender or not, which is of a kind not in circulation in New Zealand.

13. Every person who imports or attempts to import into New Zealand or exports or attempts to export from New Zealand any coined silver contrary to the provisions of these regulations commits a breach of these regulations. ealso Regulations
