This money he always carried in a dirty brown wallet with two compartments, and when the body was discovered the wallet and money were missing. He was last seen alive at 7.40 p.m. on the 3rd instant, and investigations show that after killing his victim the murderer locked the door of the hut, and removed the key, which was found on the morning of the 6th instant on the Picton Croquet Ground about a quarter of a mile away.
