PERSONS WANTED.

WHANGAREI.—Between the 11th and 16th December last, for false pretences, **John Kingsford Hennessey**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1932, pages 73 and 85, and Photographs, 1923, page 10. AUCKLAND.—**Robert Charles Laidlaw**, failing to pay unemployment levy: It has been ascertained by the Auckland and Wellington police that he left this Dominion for Australia in February, 1931. (See Police Gazette, 1931, page 569.) *Arrested 21/4/32.*

Should they or either of them be located they are not to be questioned, but an urgent communication is to be sent to the Commissioner of Police Wellington, in whose office finger-prints and a photograph, believed to be those of the offenders, are filed.
