### Illegal Lottery.

WANGANUI.—**Francis Henry Holz**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1931, page 291, has commenced an illegal lottery, the winner of which is offered a Junior Chevrolet saloon motor-car. Eighty thousand tickets have been printed, and he is alleged now to be in the South Island arranging for the disposal there of some of the tickets, which are printed on blue paper, bearing the signature "R. R. Parkes, organizer," and are to be sold at 6d. each. A license to dispose of the motor-car by lottery has not been granted, and inquiries are to be made throughout the Dominion with a view to obtaining the names and addresses of sellers of the tickets, and also of persons whom Holz has appointed as his agents.

### Arson.

WELLINGTON.—About 3 p.m. on the 17th June last, some person or persons willfully set fire to an apartment-house at 122 Vivian Street. The premises were occupied by **Phillip Gordon Brazier**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1933, page 585, and the last-known person to leave them was **Thomas Alexander McNeil**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1933, page 713. At a Coronial inquiry on the 6th instant the evidence disclosed that the former was absent while the building was burning, but he had his furniture and effects considerably overinsured, and he is suspected of having counselled the commission of the offence. Any information that would assist in establishing the identity of the person who set fire to the building is to be communicated to the Superintendent of Police, Wellington.
