## SPECIAL NOTICE.

### Disqualification under Motor-vehicles Act removed.

INVERCARGILL.—The disqualification from obtaining a motor-driver's license imposed upon **Eric Soderstom**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1933, page 330, has been removed as from the 12th September, 1934.

## INQUIRIES, ETC., FROM OUTSIDE NEW ZEALAND.

Murder.

*Identity established, 23/10/34*

SYDNEY (AUSTRALIA).—Above are photographs of an unknown female whose dead and partly burned body was discovered in a corn-sack, under a culvert, 4½ miles from Albury, on the Howlong Road, at 9 a.m. on the 1st September, 1934. Description: Believed to be between twenty and thirty years of age, 5 ft. 2 in. or 3 in. high, slim to medium build, light-brown hair, darker nearer the roots, and may have been peroxidized or bleached, bluish-grey eyes, plucked eyebrows, finger-nails manicured to a point, and bearing traces of red cutex tinting. Particulars of teeth are as follows: Right lower jaw—Wisdom tooth and first molar missing, second molar has large gold inlay. Right upper jaw—Wisdom tooth and second molar filled with amalgam, first molar missing. Left lower jaw—Last four teeth, including wisdom tooth, missing. Left upper jaw—First and second molars and wisdom tooth filled with amalgam. The body was clothed in white Canton crepe pyjama trousers with canary-coloured edgings, and a coat of the same material the major portion being canary-coloured with a white collar and white band around the bottom, with an Oriental design worked on the front in white silk. Around the head of deceased was wrapped a large white bath towel, with three red stripes across either end. On one corner of the towel is believed to be a laundry mark which could be deciphered as either of the following: "R.I.W." or "Q.I.W." The first letter is definitely "Q" or "R," the second a stroke, and the third could be either "W," "N," or "H." The bag containing the body bears the letters "D.E.," but all other lettering has been destroyed by fire. Urgent inquiry is requested at all hotels, private hotels, boardinghouses, lodging-houses, residential, dentists, side-show people, &c., with a view to tracing the identity of deceased, and also at laundries in regard to the markings on the towel. The photographs of deceased should be compared with those of missing women or girls who may have left this Dominion for Australia. Any information to be urgently communicated to the Commissioner of Police, Wellington. (C.R. 34/134.)

The following is a later description of clothing, towel, bag, and teeth: On further examination letters were found on the pyjama coat in marking-ink on the bottom, at the side seam, running down from the right armpit, and the theories advanced as to what this lettering is are as follows—(1) "Cis M," and either three or four letters following finishing with the letter "A." (2) The whole thing is one name commencing with "Com" and finishing with "A." (3) The general outline suggests the name "Camula," "Cameron," "Pamula," or "Pamela" (this is without looking at any individual characteristics). Silk experts say that the pyjama suit described is known as Kabe crepe, an imported, exclusive, and expensive article. The garment is made in the East, and may be stocked in large country towns, but only high-class country stores or city establishments would have it for sale. Around the head of the deceased was wrapped a large face or bath towel of Japanese manufacture, and has a hem on either end ¾ in. wide and two red bands ¾ in. wide, 5 in. and 6 in. from each end, and a red band ¼ in. wide, 8½ in. from the end, the laundry mark "R.C.O." or "M.C.O.," probably the former, being in the hem in the corner. The bag containing the body bears the letters "DALM" over "1" over "GRADE" and probably the "DALM" refers to "Dalmore," a town in Victoria, where it is understood potatoes are graded, and the bag may possibly be a potato-sack. Description of Teeth and Fillings: Upper right jaw—second molar, gold (probably 22 ct.) inlay in occlusal involving the mesial pit, but not extended to the distal pit or buccal fissure; third molar, small amalgam pit filling not involving any fissures. Upper left jaw—first molar, amalgam filling involving all the occlusal pits and fissures; second molar, amalgam filling involving distal pit but not extending past the central pit; third molar, amalgam filling in occlusal surface larger than the filling in opposite wisdom. Lower right jaw—gold inlay involving all occlusal fissures. Lower left jaw—no fillings at all. Missing teeth: Upper right jaw—first molar missing. Upper left jaw—no teeth missing. Lower right jaw—first molar and wisdom tooth missing; first molar extracted between the age of six and twelve years. Lower left jaw—second bicuspid, first molar, second molar, and wisdom tooth missing. General description of mouth.—Second lower right bicuspid twisted distally: high and broad palate; second upper left bicuspid elongated; articulation of anterior teeth good with fairly big overlap of upper incisors; no blemishes on enamel; no signs of pyorrhœa; short upper lip; rugæ not abnormal, but well formed; no abnormal lingual prominences; very little collection of tartar; cusp formation normal; lower molars on left side apparently extracted a number of years; no crowns or bridges. (C.R. 34/134.)
