2. The Wigram Aerodrome, Christchurch.

An officer is always sent to the scene of an aeroplane accident, and his services on written or verbal request to the Director of Air Services, Wellington, would be made available to the Coroner and the police in connection with any inquest.

In such cases the police inquiring into the accident should make application through the Officer in Charge of the district to the Director of Air Services, with a view to obtaining the advice and assistance of an officer of the Air Force and having his evidence available at the inquest.
