Forged Cheque for £1,000 uttered.

Forged Cheque for £1,000 uttered. NAPLER.—On 19th ultimo, a forged cheque for £1,000, dated 18th February, 1935, on National Bank of New Zealand, Napier, No. W 66303, made payable to "303" signed "Henry D. Hardy," was presented at the National Bank of New Zealand, Ltd., Napier, by an unknown man, who received two hundred £5 New Zealand Reserve Bank notes. The cheque is alleged to have been stolen from the cheque-book of Henry Dalton Hardy, sheep-farmer, Hawke's Bay, which was issued to him by the bank on the 26th July, 1934. It was the last but one in the cheque-book, and the butt was also missing from the book. Hardy issued the last cheque in the book on the 1st November, 1934, and the butt of that cheque is also missing from the book. The following is a description of the man, as supplied by the bank official who saw him at the time he presented the cheque : Age about forty-five, height about 5 ft. 11 in., strong build, inclined to be stout, florid complexion, full face, strong lower jaw, lower lip inclined to protrude, clean-shaved, strong voice, jaw, lower lip inclined to protrude, clean-shaved, strong voice, believed native of New Zealand; dressed in a dark suit, dark-brown felt hat with brim turned down all round ; smarth dressed, and had the appearance of a farmer. The bank officials have some recollection that he said his name was **Barrett**, but they are not clear about it.
