Railway-pass Lost.

WELLINGTON.—A police second-class railway-pass, No. 613, on issue to Senior Sergeant at Central Station is missing. Last record of issue was in July, 1932. Members of the Force are to be on the alert to recover the pass.

Sentence remitted.

The sentence of seven years imposed upon **Jack Harry Payne**, alias **Harry Payne**, at Supreme Court, Wellington, on 10th April, 1933, for robbery with violence, has been remitted by His Excellency the Governor-General. Complainant gave to **Man** (name unknown), described above, a cheque for £400 on the Union Bank of Australia, at which bank it was cashed and the sum of £400 paid out in eighty £5 notes. Accused made an appointment to meet complainant later, but they have not been seen since. **Thorley** and **Ryan** were in possession of a three-seater buff-coloured Dodge coupe motor-car, registration No. 701, which is registered in name of **Charles Robinson** showman, referred to in Police Gazette, 1931, page 749, and 1932, page 378, and Photographs, 1932, page 14. **Robinson** cannot be located, and it is possible he may be implicated in the conspiracy.
