## PERSONS WANTED.

AUCKLAND.—7th instant, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for two months in default of paying £52 14s. 6d. arrears on a maintenance order for the support of his wife, Rose Violet Rogers, 273 Dominion Road, **Francis Henry Purvis Rogers**, age forty, height 6 ft. 1 in., school-teacher, native of New Zealand, medium build, fair complexion, brown hair, hazel eyes, Roman nose, small moustache; usually dressed in a brown suit and wears horn-rimmed glasses. AUCKLAND.—5th instant, on **warrant** for failing to maintain his wife, Alice Trypena Jowsey, and three children, Pukekohe, **Frank Jowsey**, age thirty-nine, height 5 ft. 11 in., accountant, native of England, slight build, dark sallow complexion, dark hair turning grey, hazel eyes, hooked nose, large white hands; dressed in a dark-brown suit, bowler hat, brown shoes, dark-brown loose overcoat, and carries a large umbrella; plays the violin; Jewish appearance; visits Masonic lodges.

AUCKLAND.—6th instant, on **warrant** of commitment to Auckland Prison for six months in default of paying £69 15s. arrears on a maintenance order for the support of his wife, **Sydney Joseph Samways**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1935, page 455, and Photographs, 1921, page 114.

AUCKLAND.—11th instant, on **warrant** for failing to comply with the terms of a maintenance order for the support of his four children, **Clifford Wilson**, age forty, height 5 ft. 11½ in., mill hand and roadman, native of New Zealand, strong build, sallow complexion, sandy hair, hazel eyes, small nose and mouth, clean shaven; dressed in a sports suit or a navy-blue suit. Arrears to 31st ultimo, £82 4s.

AUCKLAND.—28th ultimo, for indecently assaulting Shirley Mavis Richards, age seven, 12 Inkerman Street, Onehunga, **Man** (name unknown), height about 5 ft. 5 in., thin build, dark hair parted in centre, pimply face; a young man; dressed in woollen jumper or pullover and brownish-grey trousers. Between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. on the above-mentioned date the complainant was indecently assaulted in Cornwall Park. **No warrant.**

AUCKLAND.—29th ultimo, on **warrant** for theft of £1 10s. 2d., the property of Bernice Bathurst, baker, 64 Richmond Avenue, **Roy Taylor**, age twenty-four, height 5 ft. 9 in., clerk and bread-roundsman, native of New Zealand, slight build, sallow complexion, light-brown hair, grey eyes, moles on face; speaks quickly; sickly appearance, and he may be addicted to the use of drugs. Accused, who was employed to deliver bread, collected £1 10s. 2d. from William Charles Worth, and failed to account for it to his employer. There are other charges pending. He abandoned the bread-van in Nelson Street, and on the seat were found the empty cash-bag, his cap, and his pullover. (See Police Gazette, 1929, page 18, and Photographs, page 16.)

AUCKLAND.—3rd ultimo, for assaulting Marjorie Joan Codlin, typiste, 9 Belvedere Road, Epsom, **Man** (name unknown), height about 5 ft. 8 in., strong build, middle aged; wearing an old fawn tweed overcoat and an old greyish felt hat with turned-up edge. At about 10.20 p.m. on the date mentioned, complainant was walking along Mount St. John Road, when she was assaulted. **No warrant.**

AUCKLAND.—1st ultimo, for assaulting Vera Johnston, theatre usher, Gladwin Road, Epsom, **Man** (name unknown), age about fifty, height about 5 ft. 8 in., fairly stout build; shabbily dressed in a fawn raincoat and soft greyish felt hat. At about 11 p.m. in Gladwin Road complainant was assaulted. **No warrant.**

PAPAKURA.—12th ultimo, on **warrant** for theft of a ladies' watch (recovered), value £30, the property of Kate Millicent Alexander, Manurewa, **John Edward Owens**, alias **Charles Owens**, alias **Martin**, alias **Kelly**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1935, pages 613 and 632, and Photographs, 1930, page 20. He was well dressed in a light-grey suit and fawn soft felt hat. In company with Connie Wallace, he stayed with complainant for a few days. The watch was subsequently recovered in a second-hand shop at Papakura, where it had been sold by a man who gave the name **George Murray**. The photograph of **John Edward Owens** has been identified as the man who sold the watch.

HAMILTON.—7th instant, for a breach of his probation (Offenders Probation Act, 1920), **Leslie Robert Sneddon**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1935, page 571. He has failed to report to a Probation Officer, and he has also failed to make restitution of £4. His arrest is desired.

TAURANGA.—On or about the 27th ultimo, on **warrant** for theft of a ladies' brown handbag; an unemployment levy-book; a post-office savings-bank book, No. 728, in name of Florence Lillian Ojala; and five £1 notes; total value, £5 6s. 6d., the property of Konsta Ojala, farmer, and Florence Lillian Ojala, **Ray Morley**, age about twenty-eight, height 5 ft. 7 in., labourer, slight build, fair complexion and hair, brown eyes, round shoulders, stooped, large sore on left wrist; dressed in brown trousers, grey sports coat, felt hat, tan shoes, and heavy double-breasted overcoat of woolly material. Accused was employed by complainant from the 15th to the 27th ultimo, and after he left the property was missed. He may be identical with **Horace Raymond Edlin**, referred to in following paragraph and "Property Stolen" this issue.

NAPIER.—18th January last, on **warrant** for theft of a gentlemen's bicycle (recovered), value £7, the property of Leonard George Earnshaw, 95 Wellesley Road, **Horace Raymond Edlin**, alias **Norman Grant**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1935, page 583, and Photographs, 1923, page 9. The bicycle was stolen from the Telegraph Office, Napier, on the 18th January, 1935, and sold to a second-hand dealer in Auckland on the 13th September last by accused, who was interviewed by the Auckland police, and stated that the bicycle was his own property.
