INQUIRIES, ETC., FROM OUTSIDE NEW ZEALAND.

Melbourne (Australia).—At 10.30 p.m. on the 22nd ultimo, at Parkville, **Two Men** (names unknown), one armed with a revolver and the other carrying a torch, accosted Police Superintendent Brophy and fired at him four shots which inflicted serious injuries. The bullets used were 45 calibre lead bullets of Belgian make with black powder. Description of offenders—(1) Age about thirty-seven, height about 6 ft., good build; dressed in a dark suit; had white handkerchief tied round lower portion of face, and carried a revolver. (2) Age about thirty-three, height about 5 ft. 8 in., good medium build; dressed in a dark suit; had a white handkerchief tied around lower portion of face and carried a torch. About 9.45 p.m. on the 29th ultimo, Mr. Chandler, dairy-produce merchant, was held up in Sydenham Street by a man armed with a revolver (another man remaining in a motor-car), who fired three shots at Mr. Chandler and then stole £50 from him. The man who did the shooting is described as: Age about twenty-eight, height about 5 ft. 11 in., thin build and features, high forehead; dressed in a dark suit and hat, and had a navy silk searf over the lower portion of his face. The bullets used were 45 calibre lead bullets, and similar to those used by Superintendent Brophy's assailants. If in New Zealand there are arrested any offenders armed with a 45 calibre revolver, an urgent communication is to be sent to the Commissioner of Police Wellington. POLICE GOLD MEDAL ESSAY COMPETITION.—RULES FOR THE 1936 Competition.

- 1. The competition shall be held annually, and shall be open to serving members of regular Police Forces within the Empire or Mandated Territories. Any question as to the eligibility of any competitor shall be determined by the Council.
- 2. His Majesty's gold medal and a cash prize of thirty guineas will be awarded for the essay which is adjudged to be the best, provided it is considered of sufficient merit, and second and third prizes (of twenty guineas and ten guineas respectively) will be awarded under the same conditions for the essays adjudged to be next in order of merit.
- 3. (a) Essays must be the original work of the competitor. (b) Essays must not be less than 7,000 or more than 11,000 words in length and must be typewritten and submitted in triplicate.

(c) Where a reference is made to any published work the title must be quoted in a footnote.

- 4. Essays must be submitted **anonymously**. Each essay must be accompanied by a sealed envelope bearing on the outside a *nom de plume* or motto, and containing the competitor's name, rank, and address.
- 5. The Council may, at their discretion, appoint such persons as they think fit to act as Referees or Judges of the ssays under such conditions as they may prescribe.
- 6. The award of the Council shall be made public in such a manner as the Council shall think fit, and any essays submitted for the competition and adjudged of sufficient merit may be published by the Council in the *Police Journal* or otherwise.
