AUCKLAND.—27th May last, on warrant for assaulting Donald Kipling, taxi-driver, 19 Edenvale Road, **Frank John Hertz**, alias **Franklin John Smith**, alias "**Pit Pot**" **Smith**, age thirty-nine, height 5 ft. 5½ in., showman, native of New Zealand, stout build, fresh complexion, black hair, blue eyes, scars on left arm, scar above left knee.
