Travelling-allowances.

The following amended scale of travelling-allowances has been approved under Regulations Nos. 491 and 492, and will take effect from 1st November, 1936:—

Superintendents, Inspectors, and Sub-Inspectors	20s. per diem.
Senior-Sergeants, Senior-Detectives, Sergeants, and Detective-Sergeants	15s. per diem.
Constables, Detectives, and Acting-Detectives	13s. per diem.

ALLOWANCES ON RELIEVING OR TEMPORARY DUTY.

When members of the Force (other than commissioned officers) are sent to another station on relieving or temporary duty for more than one week, travelling-allowance according to the above scale shall be payable for the first week, and for the subsequent period allowance shall be payable at the following rates:—

Senior-Sergeants, Senior-Detectives, Sergeants, and Detective-Sergeants	8s. per diem.
Constables, Detectives, and Acting-Detectives	7s. per diem.

Such members shall while in receipt of this reduced allowance be entitled to claim a refund of any actual expenses incurred during absence on duty from the station at which they are doing relieving or temporary duty.

Paragraphs 1 and 2 of Circular No. 6/31 are amended accordingly.

Prisoners' Rations.

From 1st December, 1936, a uniform payment of 3s. per ration of three meals will be paid in respect of all rations chargeable against this Department—viz., rations supplied to prisoners in police lock-ups from the time of arrest until they are dealt with by the Court, and in the case of those committed to prison, until they are lodged in the prison to which they are committed.

Rations supplied to prisoners serving sentences in police lock-ups in terms of Section 17 of the Statute Law Amendment Act, 1917, are chargeable against the Prisons Department, and will be paid for at the rates fixed by that Department.

In the case of prisoners detained in police lock-ups on remand or committal for trial, the cost of rations supplied will be payable by this Department where the period of remand or committal does not exceed three days, but if it should be necessary or advisable to detain the prisoner in the lock-up for a longer period than three days, the cost of rations for the whole period of remand, &c., will be payable by the Prisons Department.
