## SPECIAL NOTICE.

**NEW PLYMOUTH.**—On the 26th ultimo, a pair of crutches and three pairs of socks were found on the foreshore between the railway-station and the baths. The socks had never been worn, and it has been ascertained that they were purchased from Messrs. Broome and Lynch, clothiers, New Plymouth, on the previous evening by a man described as follows: Age about thirty-two, height 5 ft. 6 in., medium build, fresh complexion, black hair inclined to be curly; wearing a dark-brown suit, soft double collar, and tie; had both legs but was using crutches. A railway porter saw a man on the New Plymouth Railway-station at 11 p.m. on the 25th ultimo. This man was carrying a small parcel and had crutches. Description of crutches found: 4 ft. 1½ in. long, padding on top covered with dark-brown linoleum-cloth, shod with circular black rubbers extending 3 in. up legs, wooden hand-grips inserted in forks, bottoms of forks bound with dark-brown linoleum-cloth, black paint-mark on under side of one arm-rest. It is feared that a tragedy has occurred, and inquiries are to be made at hospitals, &c., concerning men known to be cripples, with a view of locating the owner. Any information regarding this matter is to be forwarded to the Inspector of Police, New Plymouth.

## Statements or Telephone Messages from Private Individuals.

In future when any private individual calls at a Police Station or communicates by telephone to report an offence or make a complaint or other statement, the statement or telephone message is to be taken at once irrespective of where the complainant resides or where the offence was committed, and in no circumstances is the person who calls or telephones to be referred to another Station. When the statement or message has been taken, it shall be attended to if it refers to a matter in the receiver's own sub-district. If it is for attention outside his sub-district he shall telephone particulars to the Station concerned if the matter is urgent and then furnish a report in the usual way. If the matter is not urgent it may be dealt with by post.

## REGULATIONS UNDER THE REGULATIONS ACT, 1936.

Serial Number 140/1937.

## THE MOTOR-VEHICLES (SPECIAL TYPES) REGULATIONS, 1937.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.

Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Motor-vehicles Act, 1924.

Date on which the regulations were made: 22nd day of March, 1937.

Date of notification in *Gazette*: 31st day of March, 1937.

## REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor-vehicles (Special Types) Regulations, 1937.

2. These regulations shall come into force on the first day of the month following their publication in the *Gazette*.

3. In these regulations "the principal Act" means the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924.

4. The Motor-vehicles (Special Types) Regulations, 1935,\* are revoked.

5. All warrants and acts of authority and all other matters, acts, and things which originated under the regulations hereby revoked and are of continuing effect at the time of coming into force of these regulations shall enure for the purpose of these regulations as if they had originated under these regulations.

6. It is hereby declared pursuant to the power in that behalf contained in the paragraph numbered 2 of the First Schedule to the Motor-vehicles Amendment Act, 1934-35, that the following motor-vehicles shall be exempt from the payment of annual license fees under the principal Act:—

(i) Such motor-vehicles described in the First Schedule hereto as are used on public roads only in proceeding from one place to another for use in operations for which the vehicle is exclusively or principally designed, or for the garaging or repair of such motor-vehicles:

(ii) All motor-vehicles of the kinds described in the Second Schedule hereto.

7. It is hereby declared pursuant to the power in that behalf contained in section 4 of the Motor-vehicles Amendment Act, 1934-35, that the provisions of the said section 4 shall be applied to all motor-vehicles of the following types or classes—namely, such motor-vehicles of the class numbered 2 in the First Schedule hereto as are self-propelled and are exempted from payment of annual license fees by reason only of the last preceding regulation:

\* *Gazette*, 17th May, 1935, Vol. II, page 1366.

Provided that the provisions of the said section 4 shall not be deemed to be hereby applied to any motor-vehicle specifically exempted from payment of annual license fees by the First Schedule to the Motor-vehicles Amendment Act, 1934-35.

---

FIRST SCHEDULE.

*Class 1.*—Any motor-vehicle or trailer designed and used exclusively or principally for use in agricultural operations, inclusive of huts, galleys, and similar vehicles used in connection with such operations.

*Class 2.*—Any motor-vehicle or trailer designed and used exclusively for driving or carrying—

- (a) Well-boring apparatus ;
- (b) Saw-bench apparatus ;
- (c) Cranes ;
- (d) Air-compressor plants ;
- (e) Extension ladders ;
- (f) Scoops ;
- (g) Trench diggers ;
- (h) Excavators ; or
- (i) Log haulers.

---

SECOND SCHEDULE.

(1) Any agricultural tractor as defined by section 2 of the Motor-spirits Taxation Amendment Act, 1928, if used for agricultural purposes connected only with a farm or farms occupied by a person who is an owner of the tractor within the meaning of the principal Act.

(2) Any motor-vehicle which is designed and used exclusively or principally in connection with the construction or maintenance of roads or streets (inclusive of huts, galleys, and similar vehicles) and which upon application by or on behalf of the owner is approved by the Minister of Transport for exemption under this Schedule, as from the date fixed in such approval.
