Police Identification-card Lost.

WELLINGTON.—On the 23rd or 24th March last Constable Frederick Alexander Banks, No. 2678, lost his identification-card. Members of the Force are to be on the alert to recover it.

PERSONS WANTED

AUCKLAND.—2nd March last, for obtaining credit by fraud, **Percival Richard Parker**, age twenty-five, height 5 ft. 10½ in., labourer, native of New Zealand, medium build, dark complexion, brown hair, blue eyes, mole on right cheek, small scar on back of right hand; dressed in a navy-blue suit and white-and-tan shoes. Accused employed Frederick John Dickey, taxi-driver, 212 Mt. Smart Road, Onehunga, to drive him to near Waiuku. When they reached there he said he had left his wallet at 22 Marsden Avenue, Auckland, and engaged complainant to drive him back to that address. He is a married man. He was in possession of a Chrysler De Soto motor-car, registration No. Vic. 201—979. It is thought that he may now be in New Zealand, and his extradition expenses are guaranteed. REGULATIONS UNDER REGULATIONS ACT, 1936.**Serial Number 173/1937.****THE OPOSSUM REGULATIONS, 1934, AMENDMENT NO. 2.**

Enacting authority : His Excellency the Governor-General in Council.
Act pursuant to which the regulations were made : The Animals
Protection and Game Act, 1921-22.

Date on which the regulations were made : 11th day of May, 1937.

Date of notification in *Gazette* : 13th day of May, 1937.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Opossum Regulations, 1934, Amendment No. 2.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Opossum Regulations, 1934* (hereinafter called "the principal regulations").

3. Clause (8) of Regulation 5 of the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted :—

"(8) No person shall on or after the 1st day of June, 1937, present any skins to an officer authorized to receive royalty or deliver any skins to a licensed broker unless each such skin has been legibly marked before drying in indelible pencil, or by other similar effective means, with the number of the license or permit of the person who took or killed the opossum, followed in each case by the letter 'Z.'"
