THE CORONERS' FEES AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1937.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: Section 2 of the Coroners Amendment Act, 1920.

Date on which the regulations were made: 6th day of January, 1937. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 8th day of January, 1937.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Coroners' Fees Amendment Regulations, 1937.
- 2. These regulations shall come into force on the day following notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
- 3. The regulations, made under section 2 of the Coroners Amendment Act, 1920, on the 19th day of October, 1931,* are hereby amended by revoking the proviso therein following the words "For every inquest £1 Os. Od."
- 4. The said regulations are further amended by inserting after the item "For making a post-mortem examination, &c., £3 3s. 0d." the following additional words:—
- "Provided that the Minister of Justice may allow a larger fee than any of the foregoing in any case where he considers that exceptional circumstances render such a course desirable."

THE BIRD-LIME REGULATIONS, 1936.

Enacting authority: His Excellency the Governor-General in Council. Act pursuant to which the regulations were made: The Animals Protection and Game Act, 1921-22.

Date on which the regulations were made: 6th day of January, 1937. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 8th day of January, 1937.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Bird Lime Regulations, 1936.
- 2. These regulations shall come into force fourteen days after the day of the notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
- 3. In these regulations, unless inconsistent with the context, "bird lime" includes all substances of a similar nature.
- 4. No person shall have any bird lime in his possession or sell or agree to sell or offer for sale or purchase or agree to offer to purchase any bird lime.
 - 5. No person shall use bird lime for the purpose of capturing or
- attempting to capture birds.

 6. Every person who offends against the provisions of these regulations is liable on summary conviction to a fine of £5, for a second offence to a fine of £10 pounds, and for any subsequent offence to a fine of £20
