Child unlawfully abandoned.

PETONE.—Between 8 p.m. and 11 p.m. on the 5th instant, a new-born male child was unlawfully abandoned by some person on a veranda of a dwelling at 11 Buick Street. When found the child was unharmed, but the umbilical cord had not been severed. It's clothing consisted of a ladies' old woollen singlet, a portion of a cotton singlet, a ladies' home-made dark-brown cardigan of stocking stitch with seven silver-coloured buttons of the size of a threepenny piece down front, and some remnants of old white cloth. The child was born only a few hours previously to being discovered on the veranda, and its weight was 7 lb. 13 oz. It is at present in the care of Nurse Smith, Buick Street. Any information which might assist in establishing the identity of the parents of the child is to be communicated to the Superintendent of Police, Wellington.

PERSONS WANTED

AUCKLAND.—**William McIntosh Ogilvie**, failing to maintain (see Police Gazette, 1937, page 596). When arrested he is to be interviewed regarding a false statement he made to the Helensville police on the 27th July last that the Waimauku School, of which he was headmaster, had been broken into and £1 stolen, together with an office drawer and school records. It is now considered that he burnt the drawer and records.

AUCKLAND.—15th June last, for false pretences—(1) **Henry John Carter**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1937, page 679, and (2) **Man**, whose name is thought to be **J. McQuillen**, age about twenty-one, height about 5 ft. 7 in., salesman, medium build, red hair. They called on John Angus Sidwell, farmer, Warkwork, and demonstrated what they represented to be preservative paint. Being satisfied with the demonstration complainant ordered fifteen gallons, which was delivered on the 15th and 16th June by McQuillen, who received £4 14s. for it, and gave a receipt. The mixture was subsequently found to be used engine oil containing a small amount of pigment, and of no value as paint. There are similar charges pending. When located they are to be interviewed. **No warrants.**
