Identifiable except money. A hand trolley, which had been taken from Goodson's Carrying Co. yard, Pukuatua Street, between the 21st and 23rd ultimo, was used to remove the safe from the hotel. This trolley was subsequently recovered from the Uthina Stream. The offence may have been committed by **Hohepa Te Rake Te Kiri**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1934, page 326, and **Buddy William McDonald**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1937, page 535. They have been interviewed, but no evidence resulted. **McDonald**, is the owner of a 1937 model Ford V. 8 half-ton truck, painted green, 1937-38 registration No. L. 27,962.

Memorandum.]

### Motor Accident Statistics.

The following copy of a memorandum, which has been received from the Commissioner of Transport, is published for the information and attention of members of the Force when preparing motor accident report forms:—

“From the experience gained with the new motor accident report form, it is found that in a very large number of instances the reporting officer omits to underline the cross marking the main cause. This point is referred to in the notes for the information and guidance of officers and also upon the form itself. It would obviate a great deal of work in returning the forms for further particulars if this point could be given greater attention.

“Another feature which has arisen is in regard to the general marking of items where the particulars cannot be obtained. Frequently reports will come in with no entry under some particular item and it is not known whether the item has been overlooked or whether the particulars are not available. If instructions were given that where the information was unavailable, a note to that effect be made on that item on the form, this would be of great assistance.

“I would suggest entering some abbreviated note such as ‘N.A.’ for not available.”
