Motor Accident Statistics.

The following copy of a memorandum received from the Commissioner of Transport is published for the information and attention of members of the Force when preparing motor accident report forms.

D. J. Cummings, Commissioner of Police. 5th June, 1938. (P. 36/1431.) Wellington, 15th June, 1938.

MOTOR ACCIDENT STATISTICS.

In order to identify the individual accident prone drivers, In order to identify the individual accident prone drivers, I now wish to arrange for a record to be kept by the Transport Department of the names of all motor-drivers involved in accidents. Unfortunately, however, the accident report form does not now provide for this information. I should be glad therefore if you would co-operate in this matter by issuing instructions to all reporting officers to enter the full name of the driver of each motor-vehicle involved. The appropriate place for entering this information would appear to be in the blank space underneath item "(g) State whether Driver Licensed (Yes or No):" in Sections 4 and 5 on the form. and 5 on the form.

I should be grateful if this instruction could be given as early as possible in order to include the largest possible

as possible in order to include the largest possible number of drivers involved.

A further point to which I should be pleased if you would draw the attention of reporting officers relates to Section 8—
"Causes Attributed to Drivers." Items 4, 5, and 6 are designed to cover all cases of failure to keep to the left. Some reporting officers mark item 6 where the accident occurred at a bend, whereas either item 4 or 5 should be marked according to the circumstances. The common error is made of confining 4—"Cutting Corner" to accidents at intersections. This is intended to cover cases at bends in the road also. A large number of reports have lately been returned in connection with this point, and inconvenience to both Departments would be obviated if attention were given to this point by the reporting officer.

Another feature which has been noted in connection with the filling in of Section 8 is the tendency to enter "Rain" as a factor in causing the accident in every case where the number of drivers involved.

as a factor in causing the accident in every case where the weather was wet. While this Department has no means of checking the causes in respect of individual reports, it seems checking the causes in respect of individual reports, it seems unlikely that weather would play such a vital part in causing accidents as the reports seem to indicate. The essential point in determining whether any particular item should be marked as a contributory cause of the accident is the answer to the query "would the accident have occurred if this circumstance was not present?" Only if the reporting officer considered that the accident would not have occurred of the writer should the included and with a secretary seconds. otherwise, should the item be included, and vice versa. These remarks apply of course to all possible factors enumerated, not merely to the particular case of adverse weather conditions such as rain. I should be pleased if you would draw the attention of reporting officers to this
