## PERSONS WANTED.

WHANGAREI.—19th August last, on **warrant** for theft of a cheque for £22, the property of Harold Ernest Baigent, 518 Cooke's Buildings, Auckland, **Kenneth St. Albans Hodgson**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1938, page 702. He was employed by complainant to sell vacuum cleaners on commission, and on the 19th August last he received a cheque for £22 from William Chisholm Dempster, Otonga, in payment for a Tellus vacuum cleaner, and fraudulently omitted to pay the amount to his employer. There is another charge pending. He left for Australia on the 15th September last.

A money-order telegram for £2 was forwarded, and the money was collected by a man who signed his name as Des McClean. Other similar offences have been committed, different names having been used in each instance. **No warrant.**
