An ex-employee of the latter, known as **H. Rex Gray**, knew where the key was invariably hidden, and the writing on the cheque referred to above is similar to that of Gray. The photograph of **William George Thomas**, referred to in Police Gazette, 1938, page 30, and Photographs, 1933, page 58, has been identified as that of the man, Gray, who was formerly employed by Mr. Anderson. **No warrant.**

#### KING'S POLICE GOLD MEDAL ESSAY COMPETITION.—RULES FOR 1939 COMPETITION.

1. The competition shall be held annually and shall be open to serving members of regular Police Forces within the Empire or Mandated Territories. Any question as to the eligibility of any competitor shall be determined by the Council.

2. His Majesty's gold medal and a cash prize of twenty guineas will be awarded for the essay which is adjudged to be the best, provided it is considered of sufficient merit, and second and third prizes (of fifteen guineas and ten guineas respectively) will be awarded under the same conditions for the essays adjudged to be next in order of merit.

3. (a) Essays must be the original work of the competitor.

(b) Essays must not be less than 7,000 or more than 11,000 words in length, and must be typewritten and submitted in triplicate.

(c) Where a reference is made to any published work the title must be quoted in a footnote.

4. Essays must be submitted ANONYMOUSLY. Each essay must be accompanied by a sealed envelope bearing on the outside a *nom de plume* or motto, and containing inside the competitor's name, rank, and address.

5. The Council may, at their discretion, appoint such persons as they think fit to act as Referees or Judges of the essays under such conditions as they may prescribe.

6. The award of the Council shall be made public in such a manner as the Council shall think fit, and any essays submitted for the competition and adjudged of sufficient merit, may be published by the Council in the Police Journal or otherwise.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 4th day of May, 1939.

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. M. J. SAVAGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor-drivers Regulations 1931, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Motor-drivers Regulations 1931\* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day following their publication in the *Gazette*.†

4. The principal regulations are amended by inserting next after Regulation 8 thereof the following additional regulation :—

“ 8A. DRIVERS OF MOTOR-CYCLES OR MOTOR-CYCLES AND SIDE-CARS  
(NEW APPLICANTS).

“(1) For the purposes of this regulation—

“ ‘ Proper authority ’ means the local authority which, having regard to the district wherein for the time being the garage for the motor-vehicle is situated or wherein the applicant is permanently resident in terms of clauses (2) and (3) of Regulation 3 of the principal regulations, is the proper authority for dealing with an application for a motor-driver’s license :

“ ‘ New applicant ’ means an applicant for a license to drive a motor-cycle or a motor-cycle and side-car who is unable to produce evidence satisfactory to the proper authority that he has previously been licensed to drive a motor-cycle or a motor-cycle and side-car either in New Zealand or elsewhere.

“(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these regulations, the following provisions shall apply in the case of any new applicant.

“(3) No license to drive a motor-cycle or a motor-cycle and side-car for a new applicant shall be issued except subject to the following special conditions, which shall be inserted in the license by the proper authority but which shall apply whether they are inserted in the license or not:—

“(a) The licensee shall not carry any other person on any motor-cycle he is driving otherwise than in a side-car:

“(b) The licensee shall not drive any motor-cycle at a speed exceeding forty miles per hour on any road, street, or other place to which the public have access:

“(c) The licensee shall display in a conspicuous position at the front and at the rear of any motor-cycle he is driving, and facing directly to the front and rear respectively, distinguishing marks in the form of the diagram set out in the Schedule hereto.

“(4) (i) The licensee may at any time after the expiry of three months from the date of issue to him of a license issued under this regulation apply to the proper authority for removal of the special conditions prescribed by clause (3) hereof.

“(ii) Upon receipt of such application the proper authority shall require the licensee to be subjected to a further test by the testing officer, and on receipt of a satisfactory report from that officer, but not otherwise, may remove the said special conditions, whereupon the proper authority shall issue a certificate in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto.”

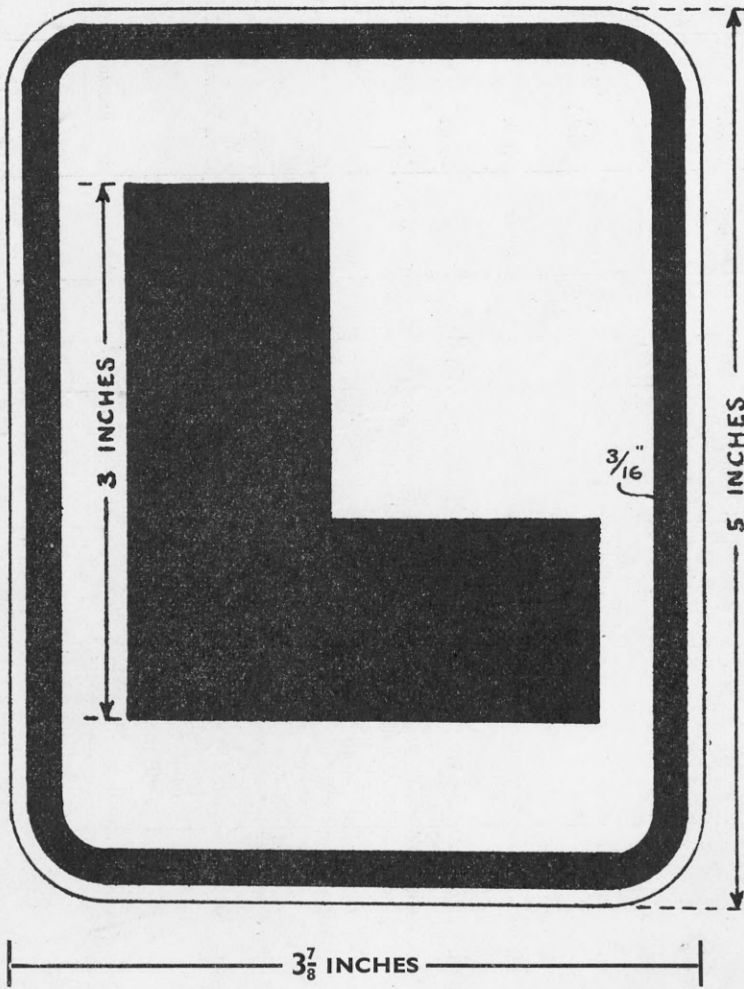
