Human Foot Found.

NAPIER.—On the 31st ultimo, a right human foot, on which was a black sock and a shoe, was found on Westshore Beach. The foot, which is definitely that of a European person, was in an advanced state of decomposition, and medical opinion is that it had been in the water for at least two weeks. The sock is of black cashmere, made of about 12 in. of the upper portion of a ladies' stocking, the smaller end having been sewn with white thread to form the toe. The shoe, which is a stout box-calf Derby, appears to be about size 7½ or 8 (probably size 8), has stout sole with slip, full round toe with punctured toe-cap, was fairly good quality when new, neatly repaired with sewn leather sole fastened with steel tangles at waist, and is in a much worn condition; on top of this sole is nailed a black cleated rubber "nail-on" sole marked "Dunlop Perdriau," and is much worn on the outside. The condition of the shoe gives the impression that the wearer was shabbily dressed. It is definitely not of New Zealand make (probably English), and the rubber sole was probably purchased in Australia, which indicates that the shoe may have been repaired there. Any information that might assist in the investigation of this matter is to be communicated to the Inspector of Police, Napier.
