Concealment of Birth.

CHRISTCHURCH.—On the 7th ultimo, the dead body of a newly-born male European child was found in the Heathcote River near Ashgrove Terrace and Young Street. There was a small bruise on the back part of the right parietal bone, but there were no other external injuries, except that the umbilical cord had not been tied. The body had apparently been wrapped in an ordinary cotton single-bed sheet which was found in the river a few feet from the body. A post-mortem examination revealed that death had occurred two or three days previously to the finding of the body, that the child was 20½ in. long, 7½ lb. weight, between the 9th and 10th month of development, had breathed, and that the cause of death was heart failure associated with hæmorrhage of the surface of the brain which the pathologist considers took place during birth and was not due to wilful injuries. Any information regarding the parentage of the child is to be forwarded to the Superintendent of Police, Christchurch.

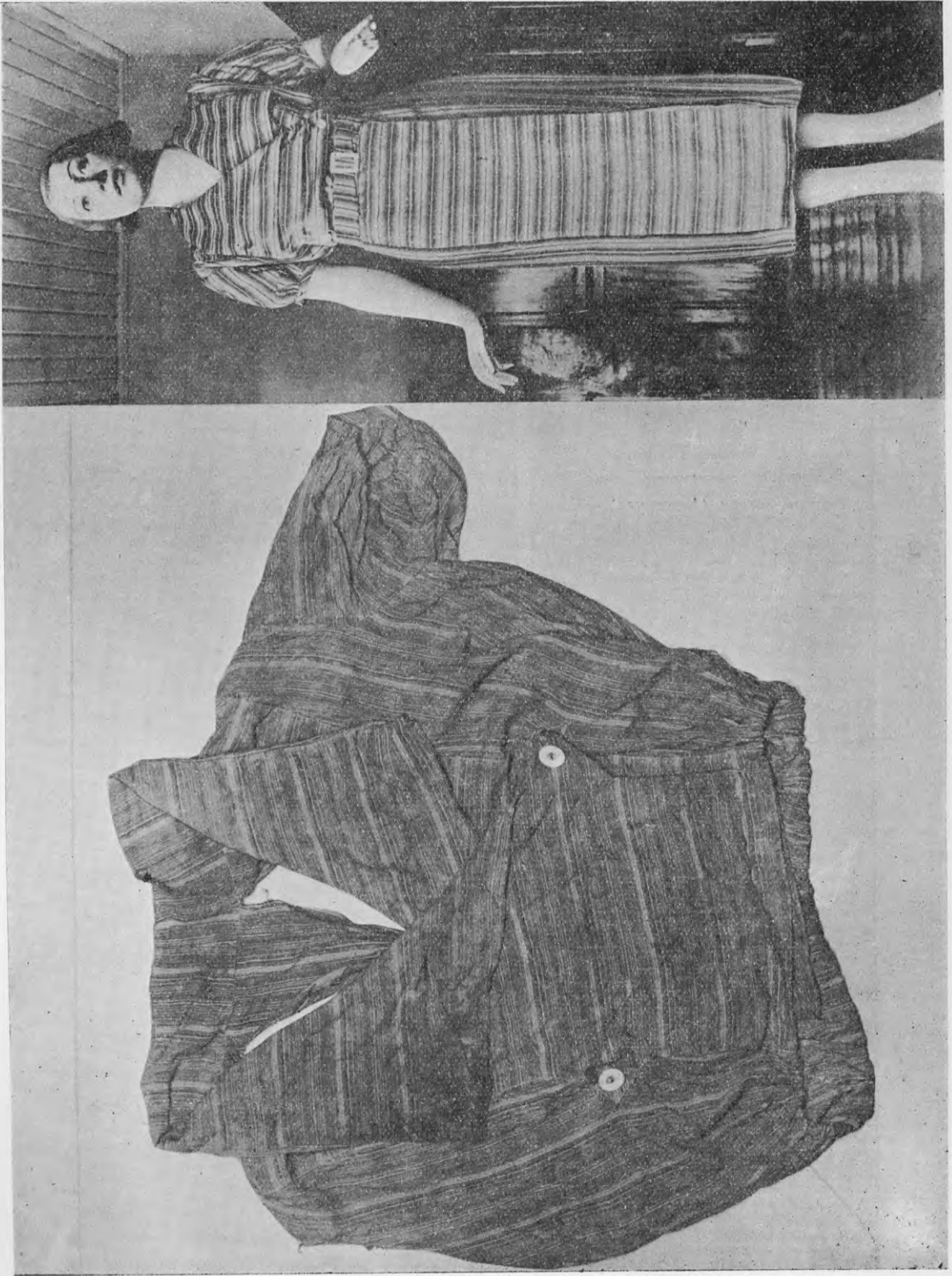

SYDNEY (AUSTRALIA).—On the 21st March last a quantity of ladies' clothing was found in a water-hole about four-fifths of a mile from the culvert where the dead body of the girl was found, whose murder is recorded in New Zealand Police Gazette, 1934, pages 525 and 569. The following is a description of the clothing: A fuji-silk crossover (or double-breasted) ladies' jumper with short sleeves and elastic at waist, two white buttons at either peak, turned-back collar terminating in wide revers, press-studs under each button to fasten down, the colour is a blue ground with fawn or gold stripes predominating, and white, red, and black pencil stripes, factory made, and originally a full-length frock which had been cut down to a blouse and stitched at waistline and sleeves, pure silk material, appears to be of 1933-34 fashion; a ladies' white or beige coloured blouse, long sleeves with cuffs finished with two press-studs, convertible collar to be worn open or with tie, elastic at waist; a silk tie with blue and white spots; a blue and grey necktie; a pair of ladies' felt slippers, size 4, red with variegated silk pom-pom, cosy suede sole and cushion heel; a pair of ladies' house sandals, size 4, square cut-outs on front upper, pump sole, bar-button strap, rubber stiffening at back of heel; a pair of ladies' rubber Wellington knee boots, size 4, fleecy lined, manufactured by Dunlop Perdriau Co. in April, 1933; and two shoe-trees, different in length, one has pink and black fancy work on steel-centre, wooden heel and toe-pieces have been painted with gold lacquer. The photographs reproduced above are: (1) The blouse referred to as having been converted from a full-length frock; (2) a frock of similar material on an artist's model; (3) the sandals; (4) the reconstructed head of the murdered girl. It has not been definitely established as yet whether or not the clothing belonged to the victim. Inquiries are therefore to be made with a view to obtaining some information which would assist in establishing the ownership of the property. (C.R. 34/134.)
