Memorandum.]

**Police Examinations : Notice of Intention to sit for Examination—Regulation No. 404.**

(1) A candidate when giving notice of intention to sit for examination in accordance with Regulation No. 404 shall specify the examination for which he intends to sit—viz., Literary Examination, Law Examination (Sergeants), Law Examination (Senior Sergeants), or Law Examination (Sub-Inspectors), as the case may be.

(2) If the candidate has obtained a partial pass and desires to complete the examination, he shall state the year in which he obtained the partial pass and the subjects in which he has passed.

(3) If he has already passed any police examination or any examination referred to in Regulation No. 417, he shall specify same and the year in which he passed.

Attention is drawn to the fact that candidates must give notice during the month of July of intention to sit for examination notwithstanding that they may have previously intimated their intention of sitting for examination when applying for the services of the coach.

**Motor Accident Report Forms.**

The following copy of a memorandum received from the Commissioner of Transport is published for the information and attention of members of the Force when preparing motor accident report forms.

**MOTOR ACCIDENT REPORT FORMS.**

Owing to the supply of forms which were printed last year having been practically exhausted, I arranged recently for a reprint. The new forms have now been received and I have sent a number out direct to the various police districts. The balance of the supply is held in my office. The form has been altered only in certain small features. These are as follows:—

1. Under sections 4 and 5 on the face of the form provision is now made for the name and address of the driver. On the previous forms the names were written in by the police officer reporting the accident, but no special place was provided and the names were thus apt to be overlooked on occasions.

2. On the back of the form under section 8, "Presumed or Apparent Causes of Accident," the wording of items 4, 5, and 6 under "Attributed to Drivers" has been altered to make it clear that each item constitutes one feature of "Failure to Keep to the Left." In the past it has been found

that a reporting officer will frequently indicate on the face of the form that the accident occurred at a bend of the road. Under "Causes of Accident" he indicates "Failure elsewhere to keep on correct side of road" (item 6) whereas either item 4 or 5 should have been marked. It is thought that the altered wording will overcome this difficulty.

3. Under section 8, item 25, "Failure to give clear signal" has been altered to read "Failure to give proper signal."

4. An additional item under "Attributed to Condition of Vehicle" has been inserted—namely, "Sudden failure of headlights."

5. Under "Attributed to Road Conditions," item 11, "Other (Specify)" has been added.

6. Under "Attributed to Weather Conditions" an item has been provided for "Fog."

While a number of the districts will still have a good supply of the old forms it is desired that these should be used up first. The alterations are not of sufficient importance to warrant scrapping the old forms and commencing with the new ones from any specific date.

I should be glad if you would draw the attention of your staff in the various districts to these matters.
