CATHOLIC AND SECULAR EDUCATION IN VICTORIA.

The Catholics of Victoria are determined to save their children from the dangers to Faith and Morals inherent in the godless system of education lately established in that colony. They are taking means to erect Catholic schools in every locality where it is possible to do so. This is their answer, and an emphatic one it is, to the calumny so frequently repeated by the Secular Press of Melbourne,—that the majority of intelligent Catholics are in favour of the Secular system, and that none are advocates of purely Catholic schools, except the clergy and the ignorant laity. Facts notorious to all prove that this falsehood is absolutely baseless, even apparently. Every where throughout the colony, Catholics, whilst paying taxes which the Government squanders in endeavouring to undermine their Faith, are contributing generously to the maintenance of Catholic schools, both male and female, and refusing to send their children to the Government schools. But what does the Secular Press care for facts which it does not like? It ignores them, and, not only that, but asserts, that that is which is not.
