CONFERENCE OF BISHOPS.

DVANTAGE was taken of the presence in Auckland of Archbishop REDWOOD and Bishop GRIMES on their return trip from the South Sea Islands to hold a conference of the New Zealand The meeting took place on Saturday, Bishops.
