Messrs. Wright, Stephenson and Co. report as follows:—
For this week's sale there was a very small entry of horses, and, owing, no doubt, to the perfect harvest weather prevailing, country buyers were conspicuous by their absence. Two consignments of useful draught mares and geldings—the one from the Tapanui district and the other from the Strath-Taieri—were the principal entries in the heavy class, and of hacks and harness horses, beyond a tew weedy sorts, there was nothing of importance on offer. The sale was a dragging one throughout, and very few animals changed hands under the hammer, but the private dealing afterwards was most successful, and, with one exception, all the draughts forward were sold at full market rates. One first-class heavy draught gelding (8 years old) was sold at L39 10s, and several other useful mares and geldings at from 1.22 to 1.30.
