As I purpose, during my canvass of the district, dealing at length with this and other matters connected with the Government policy, I here content myself with saying that I appeal to your suffrages, and rely upon receiving your support as a member of a party whose sims are directed towards such legislation as will promote the well-being, prosperity, and contentment of the people of this Colony.
