The dormitories are large and lofty, the class rooms well lighted and ventilated, and the baths sup-plied with water hot and cold. For a Boarding School, Auckland possesses unique advantages. It enjoys an immunity from extremes of heat and cold, possesses a mild and salubrious climate, and has scenic surroundings that have made it the favorite city of New Zealand to reside in. The great object of the Brothers is to give their pupils a Sound Religious Training, to teach them to be virtuous, and to accustom them to the regular practice of their religious duties, and at the same time to ilmpart to them a knowledge of such subjects as will qualify them for Public Examinations, fit them for com-mercial and professional pursuits, and enable them to religion, benefit to the State, and credit to themselves.
