The following were the papers set for candidates for the above examination:—

ENGLISH, ENGLISH ESSAY AND CATECHISM.

(N.B. The marks allotted to handwriting and spelling will be awarded on the work of this paper.)

(1) Write a short but complete essay (about two pages) on one of the following subjects:—

(a) The merits and demerits of a dry and wet summer.

(b) 'The wicked flee when no man pursueth.'

(c) In a letter to a friend describe some recent event of interest.

(2) Write out twelve sentences showing the correct use respectively of a relative pronoun, a relative adverb, an indefinite adjective, a demonstrative adjective, a demonstrative pronoun, an interrogative pronoun, an objective case, a verb in the past tense, a verb in the passive voice, a reflexive verb, a conjunction of purpose, an interjection. In each sentence underline the word in question.

(3) Write out in full the 'I confess to Almighty God.'

What do you mean by Faith, Hope, Charity, world, flesh, devil, superstition, despair, murder, falsehood, robbery, witchcraft.

What does your catechism teach you about the Holy Ghost?

Why must we (1) go to confession before going to Communion? (2) examine our conscience before going to confession? (3) have reached the age of reason before we examine our conscience?

ARITHMETIC (Time allowed 2 hours).

N.B. All work must be shown. Importance attached to method and neatness.

(1) Obtain by the shortest method you know, the product of 123123 by 125255.

(2) At the beginning of 1904 there were 68,841 Natives employed in the Transvaal mines. During January 5397 fresh Natives joined and 5471 left or died; in February 6263 joined and 5064 left or died; in March 6713 joined and 4339 left or died; in April 5284 joined and 5047 left or died; in May 4844 joined and 6643 left or died. What was the total increase or decrease at the end of this time?

(3) Distribute £292 14s 5½d among 73 persons, giving

£25 more to each of two of them than to each of the others.

(4) Four bells toll at intervals of 32, 35, 45, and 60 seconds respectively; if they all commence together after what time will they again toll together.

(5) Simplify:—

$$\frac{5}{14} - \frac{3}{7} \text{ of } \frac{1}{2} \quad \frac{1}{3} \text{ of } \frac{1}{2} \text{ plus } \frac{3}{2} \text{ of } \frac{5}{16} \text{ plus } \frac{7}{12} \text{ of } 3\frac{1}{4} - \left(\frac{7}{8} \text{ of } \frac{37}{21} - \frac{1}{3} \right) \div \frac{1}{9} - \frac{1}{3}$$

(6) Multiply 41.376 by .03548.

Divide 8.454 by 240000, .00024, 2.4.

(7) If 518 men can erect a building in 243 days, in how many days will 567 men erect one $\frac{2}{3}$ the size of the former?

(8) Find the value of 3Dm. 5m. 27cm. 5mm. at £1 5s 8d per metre.

(9) A metre being equal to 39.37 inches, and a franc being worth 10d, what is the value in English money of a yard of silk worth 7½ francs per metre?
