Students are prepared for the N.Z. University Junior and Senior Civil Service, Medical Entrance, Solicitors' General Know-edge, Bank and all other Public Examinations.

Students not preparing for the learned Professions have the advantage of a Special Commercial Course, under efficient manage-ment, where they are taught all that will be of use in mercantile pursuits.

Special attention is also paid to the teaching of Physical Science, for which purpose the Colege possesses a large Laboratory and Demonstration Hall. Vocal Music, Elocution, Drawing, and all other branches of a Liberal Education receive due attention.

Physical culture is attended to by a competent Drill Instructor who trains the students three times a week in Drill, Rifle Practice and Gymnastics. A large and well-equipped Gymnasium is attached to the College,

The religious and moral training of the pupils is an object of special care, and particular attention is bestowed on the teaching of Christian Dootrine.

A well-appointed Infirmary attached to the Gollege is under the charge of the Sisters of Compassion, from whom in case of ill-ness all students receive the most tender and devoted care, and who at all times pay particular attention to the younger and more lelicate pupils, who without such care would find the absence of home comforts very trying. THE PROVINCIAL ECOLESIASTICAL SEMINARY OF NEW ZEALAND,

HOLY CROSS COLLEGE, MOSGIEL.

IN conformity with arrangements made at the First Provincial Synod, held in Wellington in 1899, this Seminary has been established for the Education of Students from all parts of New Zealand who aspire to the Ecclesiastical State.

Students twelve years of age and upwards will be admitted,

Candidates for admission are required to present satisfactory, testimonials from the parochial clergy, and from the superiors of schools or colleges where they may have studied.

The Pension is £35 a year, payable half-yearly in advance. It provides for Board and Lodging, Tuition, School Books, Furniture, Bedding and House Linen.

The Extra Charges are : Washing, \$1 10s a year, and Medicine and Medical Attendance if required.

Students will provide their own wearing apparel, including the Soutane, as well as Surplice for assistance in Onoir.

The Annual Vacation ends on Saturday, the 15th of February. The Seminary is under the patronage and direction of the Arch-bishop and Bishops of New Zealand, and under the immediate per-sonal supervision of the Right Rev. Bishop of Dunedin.

Donations towards the establishment of Bursaries for the Free Education of Ecclesiastical Students will be thankfully received.

The course of studies is arranged to enable students who enter the College to prepare for Matriculation and the various Examina-tions for Degrees at the University.


