ST. PATRICK'S COLLEGE is intended to afford the youth of ST. The religious education of students will be attended to as a matter of the first and greatest importance. Non-Catholic Students are required to attend the common exercises of religion, and to conform to the ordinary rules of the College.

OUTFIT FOR POARDERS.

Each Intern Student requires the following Outfit:— Two ordinary suits of clothing for weekdays, one dark suit for Sundays, six day shirts, three night shirts, six pairs of socks, six pocket handherchiefs, three table napkins, two pairs boots, one pair slippers, three pairs of sheets, four pillow cases six towels, combs, brushes, and other dressing articles, one silver spoon, knife, fork, and napkin ring.
