SALARIES OF MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT

RATES OF PAYMENT ABROAD

By adopting the system of payment of Members of Parliament Great Britain (says the Daily Chronicle) comes into line with all her Overseas Dominions and all the other, great countries except Italy and Spain. It may also be noted that we revert to our old custom in paying our legislators for their services. The rate of payment of the people's representatives varies from £75 a year in a small State like Newfoundland, to £1500 a year in the United States. In the latter country, as in Germany, and certain of the British Dominions, legislators are given either free railway transit or special terms for travelling. Subjoined is a comparative table. Japan.—£200 a year for Members of the Diet, and free transit.

In addition to his salary of £1500 a year, only recently raised from £1000, he is allowed £25 a year for stationery, and allowance for a secretary, free postage, and payment for the double railway journey from his home to Washington at the generous rate of 10d per mile mile

Both Norway and Sweden provide medical aid for their legislators, and their funeral expenses. Payment of members was the custom in this country

Fayment of memoers was the custom in this country, for nearly four centuries. Probably the last paid Member of Parliament was Andrew Marvell, who was paid 6s 8d a day by Hull Corpora-tion for his services from 1661 until his death in 1678.
