No notice of Reward offered by any private party or parties, will for the future be inserted in the Police Gazette, unless there be forwarded to the Commissioner of Police, the guarantee of some responsible person, that the Reward shall be payable according to law, on the arrest or conviction of the offender, and not merely for the recovery of property.

No Horses or Cattle will be entered in this Gazette unless there are reasonable grounds to suppose that the same have been stolen.

Previous References.—It is requested that all reports respecting cases already Gazetted, should state the date and page of the Police Gazette in which the previous notice has appeared; and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected.

# HIGHWAY ROBBERY—AND STEALING FROM THE PERSON, &c.

Stolen from the person of John Ferris Martin, at the Nevis diggings, on the night of the 28th May, 1865, three £5 notes of the Bank of Australasia, Nos. 451, 1579, and 1509; one £5 note of the Bank of New Zealand, No. 117; and two £5 notes, Nos. not known, between 9 and 10 oz. of gold, two crooked sixpences, one marked with a star on the head, and a threepenny piece with a hole in it.

### HOUSEBREAKING AND STEALING FROM DWELLING-HOUSES.

### BURGLARY.

Stolen from the dwelling of Emma Lally, Dunstan, between the hours of 1 and 5 a.m. on 5th June, one lady's gold open-faced watch, No. 17353, Rotherham maker, London; gold guard, weighing 21 dwts.; and likeness brooch, with leaf cover, three vine leaves on the outward face, with bunch of grapes in centre, the leaf can be worn as a brooch separately; a small gold key with a red stone attached to the guard;—all identifiable.

Stolen from the store of Mary Jane M'Shane, Hindon, at 2 a.m. on the 30th June, one £5 note, three £1 notes, two ½ sovereigns, and 11 oz. 15 dwts. of gold.

The burglar had his face blackened, and entered Mrs. M'Shane's bedroom with a pistol presented at her, threatening her life, and on being informed that the money and gold were under the pillow, took it and decamped; no further description can be given of the burglar, other than he appeared to be about 35 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, high full face, whiskers and moustache, whiskers worn round chin.

## FELONIES AND OFFENCES NOT OTHER-WISE DESCRIBED. £50 REWARD.

A warrant has been issued by the Dunedin Bench for the apprehension of William Henry Hatch, charged with embezzling monies, the property of his late employer, Frederick Luhning, boot and shoe importer, Princes-street. The offender is described as being about 38 or 40 years of age, 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high, light hair, whiskers and beard, all cut

short but not shaved, stout build, and of good appearance. Was last seen in Dunedin on 5th June, and took a passage by steamer "Wellington" for some of the Northern Ports of New Zealand on that date. Formerly had a boot and shoe establishment in Collins-street East, near Swanston-street, Melbourne.

A warrant has been issued by the Dunedin Bench for the apprehension of Edward Ellatt, charged with deserting his wife. He is described as being 33 years of age, 5 feet 2 or 3 inches high, stout build, round shouldered, fair complexion, brown hair, long sandy whiskers worn round the chin; supposed to be now mining at Hokitiki, (Canterbury Province).

A warrant has been issued by the Dunedin Bench for the apprehension of John Cumming, charged with deserting his family. He is described as being about 20 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, black curly hair, no whiskers, dark eyes, wears a small goatee beard, a native of Devonshire, England: supposed to be now lodging at the Prince of Wales Hotel, Hokitiki (Canterbury Province), and boating on the river.

A warrant has been issued by the Dunedin Bench for the arrest of one William Heydon alias Billy Kerr, charged with stealing a dark bay cob horse branded M near shoulder, the property of Christian Larker, miner, Wetherstone's. This horse is now in possession of one Johnston, a mail contractor from Dunedin to Hindon, who bought the same at the Provincial Sale Yards on the 21st April, 1865.

Heydon, is supposed to be now at the Hokitiki Diggings.

A warrant has been issued by the Christchurch Bench for the apprehension of Josiah Long, charged with violently assaulting one Thomas Wylde, on the Payanuiroad on the 22nd April, 1865, The offender is described as about 35 or 40 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, stout build, fresh complexion, high cheek bones, brown hair and whiskers, chin shaved, an Englishman, and a carpenter by trade.

Neville Walker of Christchurch, Canterbury Province, reports having had stolen from Teremakau, on or about the 5th May, 1865, the following horses:—

A bay horse, branded 1  $\frac{2}{P}$  on shoulder,

A bay horse, branded ROE on shoulder, short tail.

A bay mare, branded M

A dark bay pony, branded AT on near shoulder.

A bay gelding, branded like JF conjoined on three places, viz. thigh and each shoulder.

One Thomas Webber is supposed to have stolen the above horses, he having been seen on the one first described at the Waihola Gorge, and will probably make for Dunedin, or Nelson. The offender is described as about 5 feet 9 inches high, 37 years of age, dark eyes, hair, and complexson, very little whiskers, which are shaved back, no moustache, speaks very quick, supposed to be an Englishman.

# INQUESTS.

An inquest was held on the 12th June, 1865, at the Shamrock Hotel Hamilton, by Charles Broad, Esq., coroner, on the body of John M'Ivor, aged 22 years, a miner, who was accidentally killed by the falling in of a tail race, on the 10th June. Verdict, accidental death.

An inquest was held on the 13th June, 1865, at the Royal Exchange Hotel, Wal-

ker-street, by Thomas Morland Hocken, Esq., coroner, on the body of Mary Ann M'Kergan, wife of Daniel M'Kergan, carter, off Walker-street, who died on the 12th June, from a fit of apoplexy. Verdict accordingly.

A magisterial inquiry was held on the 16th June, 1865, at Maori Point, Upper Shotover, by Justin Aylmer, Esq., resident magistrate, on the body of Robert Gibson, a native of County Down, Ireland, aged 28 years, a miner, who died through congestion of the brain, and exposure to cold, on the 15th June. Verdict accordingly.

An inquest was held on the 16th June, 1865, at the Court House, Hindon, by Charles Broad, Esq., coroner, on the body of George Thomas Sharpin, a native of All Saints, South Lynn, Norfolk, England, aged 28 years, a miner, who perished in a snow storm about 3 miles from Hindon. Verdict, death through exposure to cold.

An inquest was held on the 26th June, 1865, at the Shamrock Hotel, Rattraystreet, by Thomas Morland Hocken, Esq., coroner, on the body of Frances Cavan, a dressmaker, aged about 35 years, who was found dead in a water closet, on the 25th June. Verdict, died through congestion of the brain, accelerated by habits of intemperance.

### MISSING FRIENDS.

Information is requested respecting Dr. Stewart, late of the Waikato Militia, Auckland, New Zealand. He is a native of Dublin, 44 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, rather stout, dark hair, eyes, whiskers, and moustache, chin clean shaved, short nose and neck; has been in the Crimean war, and sometimes wears the Crimean medals. He is supposed to be in this Province. Photograph in Commissioner's Office.

Information is requested respecting William Henry Hobson, about 21 years of age, slight build, and about 5 feet 4 inches high. He left Christchurch, in the Canterbury Province, on the 26th December, 1862, and was last heard of at Waikouaiti in June, 1863.

# Extract from VICTORIA POLICE GAZETTE.

[From Victoria Police Gazette, 30th March 1865.]

Robert Shiel, late manager of the Plantaganet Gold Mining Company, Pitfield, is charged, on warrant, with embezzlement. He is aged about \$5,5 feet 10 inches high, 12 stone weight, fresh but freckled complexion, large full grey eyes, thick sandy hair inclined to curl, long sandy whiskers, large round head, long features, high forehead, heavy eyebrows, and straight nose, wore new grey tweed suit, and brown billycock hat. He was seen at Sandridge on the 18th instant, and is supposed to be endeavouring to get to New Zealand or Queensland.—28th March, 1865.

# THE DAYLESFORD MURDER, VICTORIA.

Information is requested of the present whereabouts of one Tom Murphy, who very probably will be able to throw some additional light on the recent murder of Margaret Graham, at Daylesford. He is about 35 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, fresh ruddy complexion, light brown hair, long nose high on bridge, slightly pockmarked, sharp dark eyes, wears brown goatee, cheeks clean shaved; believed to be an Irish Londoner; by trade a bootcloser, but works as a shoemaker, and is well known in the trade; generally wears dark clothing. Murphy formerly worked for Mr. Russell, boot and shoemaker, Daylesford, afterwards for Mr. M'Crae, a shoemaker, at Blanket Flat, near Daylesford. He has also worked in Little Bourkestreet, Melbourne.—29th March, 1865.
